



Housing Investment

(2) Sales of Condominiums







(1) CPI Comprising Items Classified by Annual Purchase Frequency




(2) CPI Comprising Items Whose Purchases Are Regarded as Basic Expenditures and Selective Expenditures



(1) CDS Premiums (Investment-Grade Firms)






(3) Swap Spreads

Change in Trade Structure


(1) Share of World Trade Volume


(2) Share of Nominal Exports





(2) Headline CPI and Core-Core CPI




(1) Japan: Headline CPI Minus Core-Core CPI


(2) United States: Headline CPI Minus Core CPI
